The next Iowa Certified Nursery Professional (ICNP) testing will be held on June 13, 2017 at the Iowa Arboretum in Madrid, IA.

Testing time: 9AM—12PM

Any individual who did not successfully complete the ICNP examination in February are able to take a re-examination in June. If an individual passes either the plant identification or written portion of the exam, that passing score is good for one

year. This means that for re-examination, you only need to take the portion you did not pass.

Researchers: Full Neonicotinoids Ban Poses Risk

Production of many field crops including vegetables is at risk if neonicotinoid pesticides are more widely restricted or banned completely, Rothamsted Research argues in a position statement published this week.

"Furthermore, if groups of chemistries are limited by legislation, the remaining groups will be more widely used, resulting in an increased risk of pests developing resistance to them," it adds.

The institute's concern follows draft proposals by the EU to replace its temporary restriction on the use of three neonicotinoids on flowering crops with a widespread ban across Europe, potentially covering all field crops, not just flowering ones.

The NFU is urging farmers and growers to make political representatives aware of the "devastating" results of a

blanket neonicotinoid ban on outdoor crops. The union has written to the European Commission outlining the consequences that it says such a ban would have on farmers.

NFU horticultural policy adviser Dr Chris Hartfield says of the research, published in Proceedings of the Royal Society B: "This is another interesting piece to an unsolved puzzle about how neonicotinoids affect bees. But it does not show that under real-life field conditions, where bees forage naturally on treated crops, neonicotinoids are causing widespread declines in pollinator populations. Farmers are well aware of the importance of bees and would not want to cause population declines."

Iowa Commercial Horticulture Survey Results

Iowa Secretary of Agriculture Bill Northey and Dr. Craig Chase from Iowa State University Extension and Outreach today announced the release of the Iowa Commercial Horticulture Survey. The data in the report is from the 2015 growing season and was collected in 2016 and analyzed this past winter.

“Overall, the survey shows a vibrant horticulture industry in Iowa, one that is adapting to new technologies and evolving to meet the demands of consumers. It provides a lot of valuable information that can help farmers, researchers, agricultural-related businesses, and the general public in efforts to understand and grow the industry in Iowa,” Northey said. “It has been more than a decade since there has been a similar survey conducted and it is great to have updated information to better understand this section of Iowa agriculture.”

The newly published survey results are from 882 horticulture crop producers across the state. The data

were recorded into an initial dataset by the Des Moines office of the National Agricultural Statistics Service. ISU Extension and Outreach’s Local Foods Program team analyzed the data including an economic impact analysis provided by Dr. David Swenson of the Iowa State Department of Economics. That analysis showed that Iowa’s horticulture industry in 2015 generated more than \$48 million in direct sales with an additional \$32 million in value-added commerce.

The wide-ranging picture gathered by the survey shows that the majority of Iowa’s horticulture farmers are relatively new to this agriculture sector, having grown commercial horticulture crops for 10 years or fewer.

The average horticulture farm size is approximately eight acres in size. Most survey respondents use horticulture crop production as means to supplement family income as opposed to deriving their main income from this type of agriculture.
