HAPPY SPRING!

The merger of the INLA Tradeshow and ISU's Shade Tree Short Course was a rousing success! There were 626 attendees, 42 exhibitors, excellent speakers (arranged by Dr. Jeff Iles) and pretty good weather. Attendees were excited to have new plants, products and equipment to look at during breaks. Exhibitors were happy to have 600+ people at a show.

At our INLA day, there were 9 people taking the certification tests and 40+ ICNPs attended the afternoon's training. Both numbers were the highest in years.

Past INLA presidents showed up early for the second annual Past Presidents' lunch and stayed late to visit with each other. During the lunch, the INRC (Iowa Nurserymen's Research Corp.) presented a check for \$100,000 to the ISU Horticulture Greenhouse Fund.

Our scholarship dinner/auction had 69 people attend and raised \$4,800 for our horticulture scholarships. All three scholarship winners were able to attend and be congratulated. Congratulations to Emma Caven of Des Moines, the 2009 Haber Scholarship recipient and Jamie Terveer of Ayrshire and Sharon Rink of Ankeny, the 2009 Community College recipients. The auctioneers alone make this an extremely entertaining event, but the reception and dinner provide one of our association's rare opportunities to network. Many thanks go to Bailey Nurseries for the reception.

As with all new mergers, there were changes suggested. Next year exhibitors will be in more central locations. There is space for large equipment in two locations outside in response to their requests. The scholarship dinner/auction will be on Thursday evening next year, possibly at Reiman Gardens. As the excitement and attendance continue to grow in the future, we can move exhibitors to Hilton Coliseum. Thanks to all of our sponsors, exhibitors and attendees for making this merger a success.

Also, please notice that we have a new executive director, Joan O'Brien. She has already sent a postcard introducing herself, with all of her contact information. We will soon have a new website, which has been needed for years. Thanks to all of you for your patience as your board has transitioned through three directors, websites, new dates and the merger with ISU for our tradeshow. We have a great, active board that has been working and will continue, to work very hard for all of you. INLA MEMBER BENEFIT: ONLINE TRAINING MODULES

Ann Marie VanDerZanden, Associate Professor of Horticulture at Iowa State University and Tigon Woline a horticulture research assistant at ISU have developed a series of 20 online training modules for INLA members. The modules are designed to serve as the training materials for the Iowa Certified Nursery Professional exam and replace the printed training manuals which were used in the past. Additionally, all INLA members have access to the modules and each company can use them as they see fit to assist with individual training needs. As examples, the modules can be used for individual professional development or new employee training and orientation.

Eight of the modules cover plant identification including the categories of: annuals, conifers, deciduous trees, groundcovers, herbaceous perennials, perennial grasses, shrubs and vines. The remaining twelve modules cover the general topics addressed in the certification exam such as: Plant Identification and Characteristics; How Plants Work: Growth and Development; Rooting Environment and Fertilization; Selection, Installation and Establishment of Landscape Plants; Turfgrass Establishment and Management; Management of Turfgrass Diseases and Insect; Introduction to Plant Diseases and Insects; Diagnosing Plant Problems; Managing Plant Diseases and Insects; Garden Center Management; Landscape Design; and New Employee Training and Professionalism.

The 12 general topic modules each contain a list of objectives, an image rich PowerPoint presentation with accompanying audio which is searchable by topic and has printable notes, self -test exercises, and online quizzes with immediate feedback to help learners test their understanding of the content.
